Tip- Feelings



- talk about feelings and what might cause them
- use descriptive vocabulary like happy, sad, angry, disappointed, excited, surprised and frustrated
- encourage your child to talk about himself
- pause while reading a book and ask how a character might be feeling
- model how to handle emotions positively yourself

Why? Since birth, your child will be developing many emotions. Even before children learn and understand language, they feel emotions. Understanding emotions will help your child develop qualities like caring, self-esteem, and flexibility which will help them to better understand others' feelings.
